One year after you leave high school, you will get a phone call asking about your life. It's a quick call with easy to answer questions, and **it's important!**

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- ✔ It's quick - "yes or no" multiple-choice questions
- ✔ It asks if you are going to school or working
- ✔ It's private: no one will share your name
- ✔ It's voluntary

What is this?

About one year after you leave high school, you may get a short phone call.
It's called the Post-School Outcomes (PSO) Survey.
The call helps Arkansas schools learn how students are doing after high school.



What is the call like?

Short and easy
Simple questions
No right or wrong answers
You do **not** need to study or prepare.



What will they ask?

You might be asked if you are:

- Working at a job
- Going to college or training
- Doing both work and school

You only answer what you are comfortable sharing.



Why does this matter?

Your answers help:

- Improve school programs
- Support students with disabilities
- Make transitions to adulthood better
